Do You Need a Reasonable Adjustment?

What is a reasonable adjustment?

Reasonable adjustments are a legal requirement to make sure health services are accessible to all disabled people (Equality Act 2010). This includes people with a physical disability, sensory disability, learning disability or a long term condition such as dementia.

The NHS must make it as easy for disabled people to use health services as it is for people who are not disabled.

This is called making reasonable adjustments. These could be things like:



Making sure there is wheelchair access



Provide a quiet waiting space



Help with forms or communication



Providing easy read appointment letters
